Unlike many of my colleagues and many of you, I can't say a personal connection was why I started working at Erskine. The only link to the Armed Forces I have is my brother's friend is currently serving with the Royal Marines. Something that rarely crossed my mind if I'm honest.

I started working at Erskine as a Community Fundraiser in 2016. It was right in the middle of our Centenary Anniversary celebrations. Looking back I couldn't think of a better time to start! Part of my role was to visit community groups and schools to tell them more about the services Erskine provides. To do that I was taking in as much as I could about our 100 year history from colleagues and residents.

### Very quickly I realised just how special Erskine is.

Part of my induction was taking a tour around the Homes and learning more about the care our dedicated staff provide. Each Home has the capacity to care for those affected by dementia. However, Erskine Park is specifically designed to support those living with dementia. At the time my Gran was also being cared for due to the disease.

After my visit to Erskine Park, I cried.

Although my Gran was receiving brilliant care where she was, all I could think was: *"If my Grandpa had done service or she was in the WRENS she could be here."* The thought and detail that goes into Erskine's care for those living with dementia is second to none.

I've since changed roles within the Fundraising and Communications Department. Now I get to create materials like this! As Supporter Development Officer I keep you, our wonderful supporters, up to date on how your donations help. You allow Erskine to continue adapting our services to meet the needs of Veterans and their families.

In recent years I think about my brother's friend more than ever. It's inspiring to see the services and opportunities now available to the younger Veteran Community here at Erskine. Knowing that you have made these things possible is something you should be proud of.

I'm privileged to see the impact of your generosity on a daily basis. There aren't enough thank yous to express how grateful we are for your continued support.

Slowly, as restrictions eased, we were able to welcome visitors back. The buzz and liveliness around the place has come back. Earlier this year we were thrilled to officially put the walking tour on the map. Literally!

You are welcome to come to the Veterans Village and walk the 1.5km route. Or you can also take a virtual tour of our stunning grounds from the comfort of your own home.



Trusts and Grants play a large role in how we fund the many outstanding opportunities and services on offer to Veterans and their spouses. This year we have been able to start two new projects based at our Activities Centre (ERMAC):

#### **Hearing Support**

Now well under way, the Ex-Service Advice Repairs and Support 2 Hear (EARS 2 Hear) project has already supported 69 Veterans, spouses and carers.

The project provides advice, support and signposting services to those who have experienced hearing issues ranging from mild to severe. This includes hearing screening, hearing aid support and maintenance and advice on useful equipment to improve daily life.

EARS 2 Hear offers drop-in sessions on a rolling basis at ERMAC as well as the sites of partner organisations across the Central Belt.

This was made possible thanks to the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust and their tremendous continued support with a Force for Change grant of £10,000.

#### Women's Wellbeing

We are also pleased to share that the Veterans' Foundation recently made a grant of £10,500 to fund ERMAC's Women's Wellbeing Sessions for one year.

The twice-monthly sessions for female Veterans, spouses and carers focus on women's health and wellbeing, offering a holistic approach that includes massage, talking therapies, relaxation, mindfulness, and other activities suggested by participants to help improve their wellbeing and provide a social space to support each other.

These sessions enable participants to relax, try new things, gain skills, socialise and share stories, as well as learn about and discuss aspects of women's health and wellbeing within a safe and sympathetic environment. Thank you again to the Veterans' Foundation for this continued support – we are very grateful.

# The Blue Light Foundation have also funded massage and wellbeing sessions for Erskine staff!

Jo Payne from the Blue Light Card Foundation said: "We are delighted to have granted funds to Erskine Veterans Charity, whose care staff work incredibly hard to support Veterans. This grant will provide an additional level of wellbeing support, allowing them to take a moment for themselves to rest and recharge."

The £5,000 will fund the continuation of regular sessions at all three Erskine Homes for a further six months.

Our therapists deliver massage sessions tailored to the individual needs of each colleague. This project will continue to have a positive impact upon the wellbeing and health of our care home staff who work extremely hard to ensure Erskine's Veterans can enjoy the best possible quality of life.

residents' hidden talents with the arts

Together with Luminate. Scotland's creative ageing organisation, we have completed our artist-in-residence programme. The programme was part of Unforgotten Forces, a partnership of 15 organisations supporting older Veterans in Scotland. Let's take a look back how this project blossomed:

In 2017 James Winnett and Gill White were the first resident artists to work closely with our Veterans. They spent two days each week collaborating with Erskine residents on a wide range of creative activities. Everything from filmmaking and sound recording to storytelling. creative writing and poetry reading. There was even model making, sculpture, stone carving, painting and drawing.

For the first few months James and Gill worked out of our Erskine Park Home at Bishopton, a purpose built home designed to care for people living with dementia. Residents created art inspired by nature and over the summer months presented an outdoor exhibition.

Upon his visit to the exhibition Professor Brendan McCormack. Head of the Divisions of Nursing, Occupational Therapy & Arts Therapies at Queen Margaret University. tweeted: "This is one of the most inspiring arts projects for people living with dementia that I have ever experienced."

Initially a three-year project it was interrupted by the pandemic. The project restarted with a new group of artists being welcomed into the Homes.

In 2022 we launched the Erskine Sculpture Trail in our woodland walk based on the grounds of the Veterans Village in Bishopton.

Displayed among the trees in the peaceful setting of the estate, the Sculpture Trail is a wonderful testament to the creativity and joy our residents experienced working alongside the artists to create a lasting display. The sculptures draw on nature, and the memories and stories of the Erskine residents, to create an interactive experience.

### **Artist in Residence Gill:**

"It was a real pleasure to spend time with each resident learning about their lives and adapting each workshop to their interests with emphasis of creating a relaxed fun environment to learn new processes and embrace the explorative nature of creativity.

We had lots of fun together and I found my time spent with Erskine residents. relatives and staff a very happy and rewarding experience both personally and creatively."

### **Erskine Director of Care, Derek Barron:**

"The Erskine Sculpture Trail reminds us of the many happy hours our residents, from all of our homes, experienced during their time spent with our very first Artists in Residence, Gill and James.

Erskine always had an extensive programme of social and recreational activities to support residents' wellbeing, however we did not have the expertise on art and artistic expression that Gill, and James provided. Working with Luminate, Gill and James has brought such a full and colourful range of artistic activities to Erskine which our residents love."

The list of titles Army Veteran Scott holds is getting longer by the day. Paratrooper, Scottish Rugby player, GB Rower, Nordic skier, Paralympian, World Championship silver medalist, runner, husband and father.

In 2021 he agreed to add one more: Erskine Ambassador.

"It is a tremendous honour to be an Ambassador for Erskine Veterans' Charity. They have been setting the standards for Veterans' care for over a century and seeing the incredible work they do gives me, and fellow Veterans, real confidence in the life-long availability to us and our families."

Scott has been a supporter of ours for the past eight years. He regularly attends our Annual Sporting Senior Games and supports a variety of fundraising events such as the Ball and Burns Supper.

A part of the Army's elite airborne infantry, 2nd Battalion The Parachute Regiment, Scott was deployed in 2011 to Afghanistan.

Whilst on patrol in the Helmand Province he lost both of his legs after stepping on an improvised explosive device. Sadly one of his best friends, Martin Bell, was killed as he and his comrades carried Scott from the minefield. Determined to honour those who saved his life and most importantly Martin, Scott returned to sports. Not only as a means to help his physical recovery but also to make the most of every opportunity and give it his focus.

In 2014 he competed at the Invictus Games and also captained the Army's Rowing Team. Fast forward to 2018 and a change in sports, Scott was selected to compete for Great Britain at the Winter Paralympics in South Korea.

### The first Para British Nordic Skier to do so in 20 years!

Scott was selected again in 2022 to compete at the Beijing Winter Paralympics and once again rewrote the history books this year by winning silver in the 12.5km Biathlon at the World Para Nordic Skiing Championships.

#### The first Briton to ever win a medal!

On his return from the championships he went through surgery, again not one to sit around Scott signed up to the Glasgow Men's 10k in June to help aid his recovery. Pulling on an Erskine vest he hit the road and proudly crossed the line supporting his fellow Veterans by raising £1,388.

We're honoured to not only have Scott as an Ambassador but to know that through Erskine's ever evolving support of Veterans we will be here for him and his family when needed.

A long standing supporter of Erskine, Jane Reid has ended her years of donations with one final gift in her Will.

The importance of supporting Veterans was always at the forefront of Jane's mind. Her father served in the First World War, both husbands served in the Second World War and she herself did her bit towards the war effort working on the LMS Railway.

Pictured is Jane on her wedding day with new husband, Johnny Lightfoot. Sadly a year into their marriage Johnny was shot down in his Lancaster Bomber over Denmark. He was 22.

After the war Jane went on to meet and marry James Reid, they happily raised a beautiful family together.

A Royal Navy Veteran, James had been plagued with the mental anguish of a crew member who didn't come home following an attack. Every Remembrance Day James would shed many tears, a memory which stayed with Jane.

Their son Gordon has shared this touching moment: "When Mum was 95, just before her dementia developed, I spent an evening going through family photos with her and she agreed we should record our conversation. It turned out to be our last chance.

Looking at the photos of wartime, I asked her how she felt at the end of the war and her answer was fascinating. Our generation have grown up being told of wild celebrations on VE Day. She didn't speak of celebration - instead she said: We were bitter. Really bitter, that so many young lives had been taken, so many young men lost.

I suppose she spoke for many war widows with these words, a voice that isn't often heard."

Jane's final gift will go towards helping Veterans who also suffer from complex issues following their time in service, much like her husband over 80 years ago.

All gifts in Wills are special. Finding out the meaning behind them makes them even more so. Thank you to Jane and her son Gordon for sharing this special story.
