If this applies to you, the difference of a lifetime could be just a quick call away.



These services play a crucial role in ensuring our residents can achieve the very best quality of life possible.

Brigadier (Ret'd) Peter Monteith, Chief of Staff at ABF The Soldiers' Charity said: "We are delighted to award Erskine with a grant to help former soldiers who are residents in its care homes across Scotland. The centre is for Veterans so it would be silly for us to schedule activities and classes without them having their say."



On yer bike mate!

We're very privileged here at Erskine to have received several outstanding grants in recent years from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust. In March, the Trust awarded a grant of £35,000 through their Positive Pathways programme for Erskine to partner with Common Wheel, a local mental health charity, to deliver a 'Build Your Own Bike' programme for members of our Activities Centre.

Our Veterans will undertake a 10-week course and work with the Common Wheel bike engineers to design, build and keep their own bespoke bike. The course will accommodate Veterans of all abilities and skill levels, helping to combat isolation and mental health issues during this challenging period for our members. We expect twenty of our Centre's Veterans to complete the course over the coming year.

Sonia Howe, Director of Policy for the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust, said: "This project embodies the ethos of our Positive Pathways programme. The Veterans involved will be learning new skills and getting out and active in a project that means something to them and results in something they can use and enjoy, knowing they've made the bike themselves. We wish Erskine and the Veterans involved all the best with these interesting workshops."

How technology can help detect pain

When you're in pain, you can usually tell someone about it. But for people living with dementia or a cognitive impairment, that isn't always possible. This can mean pain goes undetected and the person can become distressed. Now there's a solution.

As you know, we share a real commitment to providing the best standard of care for our Veterans and their spouses. With the backing of LIBOR grant funding, we've recently starting using the world's first Alpowered pain assessment tool, PainChek®, to identify and assess residents who may be in pain.


How does PainChek® help Veterans?

The app enables staff caring for residents in our four care homes to quickly and easily identify, quantify and document the pain assessment of every care home resident. This includes residents living with dementia or a significant cognitive impairment who may have difficulty communicating they are in pain.

Our registered nurses and senior care assistants record a short video of the resident's face using a smartphone and answers questions about their behaviour, movements and speech. The app uses AI (artificial intelligence) to analyse microfacial expressions that are associated with pain and combines this with the carer's observations to calculate an overall pain score.

Derek Barron, Director of Care at Erskine explains, "We use technology to enhance, rather than replace, the care we provide to residents and to maximise their potential and quality of life. Having a tool that directly supports the wellbeing of residents living with dementia is important in supporting us to deliver the right care at the right time."

PainChek helps with our overall aim to support Veterans and their spouses in enjoying a sense of comfort and fulfilment in every phase of post-service life.

Veteran Jim Legge from Elgin has completed a 681 mile cycle for Erskine. Jim completed a daunting mileage on his e-bike and has raised over £1,000 for his fellow Veterans.

The former Royal Army Medical Corps veteran set himself the challenge which started and ended at the Lossiemouth War Memorial. "Having qualified for an early COVID19 inoculation I decided to do

something about my health, despite the Service-related disability in my left-knee. I therefore upgraded my bicycle to an e-bike, through the cycle-to-work scheme. However, I knew I would fall at the first hurdle if I didn't set myself a challenge and so the idea of a Charity Cycle was formulated".



Little Lily's Challenge

To celebrate turning 10 years old, Lily McBride from Balloch, decided to take on a walking challenge. Lily walked 10km every day for 10 days prior to her 10th birthday on 7th June.

After setting herself a target of raising £500 we can tell you she absolutely smashed it and to date has raised £2,148 for Erskine.

Lily chose to fundraise for Erskine as her dad Andrew is a former serviceman and the family knew a friend who previously stayed in an Erskine Home.



Meet Findlay

92 year old Findlay McQuarrie is as Glaswegian as they come! Having joined the Royal Army Service Corps aged only 18 he quickly worked his way up the ranks from Private to Sergeant.

Having done his National Service, he returned to Civvv Street and embarked on a career in journalism. After several vears working for one of Scotland's largest newspaper groups it was time for a change, one that would see him go from PR Officer to Depute Director, Findlay said: "I had wonderful opportunities at the National Trust for Scotland, traveling extensively to countries including Japan, Australia and the Philippines. One of my proudest moments was bringing "The Tenement House" in Glasgow into the Trust's care. This living museum is an iconic part of Scotland's heritage." His dedication and commitment to the work of the Trust was recognised and rewarded with an OBE.

Most recently having lived on the banks of the Clyde, in Helensburgh, Findlay crossed the river to make Erskine his new home. Following a bad fall, combined with a debilitating eye condition, Findlay now needs a little more assistance and turned to us for this.



"As I had visited friends here many times over the years I knew exactly what I was coming to when I made Erskine my home. Although it's quieter just now due to the circumstances we are living in I have no doubt we will be getting back into the swing of things as soon as life starts to return to normal. The staff are very attentive especially the Physiotherapy team whom I can't thank enough for all the support they give me."

Free Wills Network is a service who can put you in touch with up to six local solicitors who can write a simple Will for you, for free.

Bequeathed is an online Will writing service – perfect for those who don't want to go into a solicitor's office or have the time to do so. You can simply log into a secure portal, follow the prompts and when you're happy the Will is checked by a solicitor shall then make sure everything is in order. It's really that simple!

Why leave a legacy?


